**Denise Donaldson,** MBA, CPST-I Owner, Safe Ride News Publications

Denise Donaldson is the owner of Safe Ride News, publisher of educational materials for the child passenger safety field, including the *School Bus Safety Handbook*, the *LATCH Manual*, and the *Safe Ride News* newsletter.

In 1996, she founded a program that provides child passenger safety services through Seattle-area hospitals, which she continues to run to this day. She has been a CPST-Instructor since 1998, recently served on the National Child Passenger Safety Board, and is a member of the CPS Hall of Fame.

The session today, Child Safety Restraint System Training focuses on ensuring safety for students through the proper selection and use of child safety restraint systems. This session will define each CSRS category, explore their pros and cons, cover basic usage, and highlight certain tips.



<u>Kaitlyn Sampson</u>, is an Environmental Protection Specialist for the EPA in Region 7. Kaitlyn provides technical assistance to grant awardees for the grants that are awarded to recipients. Kaitlyn works as a Project Officer on CSB and DERA Rebate Grant

opportunities. As an Environmental Specialist, Kaitlyn informs the public about grant opportunities that are available through the EPA. The EPA is providing funding from the EPA's Clean School Bus (CSB) Program to replace existing school buses with zero-emission and low-emission models, including the Diesel Emission Reduction Act (DERA).



Logan Hansch, & Mattias Schwartzkopf with Growmark FS will review the benefits of using Biodiesel. Overview: Growmark FS has been is working with

the Humboldt CSD for a fuel study comparing buses running on B20 and busses running on diesel. They have collected a year's worth of diagnostic information to show the benefits for using biodiesel from a fleet perspective, and environmental health benefits.
